

What is Florida PALM?

- Enterprise Project to replace the State's legacy accounting system,
 Florida Accounting Information Resource System (FLAIR), and the
 State's legacy Cash Management System (CMS)
 - CMS went live in Florida PALM in July 2021
 - FLAIR replacement will go live in January 2026
- FLAIR consists of the following systems that will all be replaced:
 - Central Accounting (State's Master Books)
 - Department Accounting (Agencies' Master Books)
 - Payroll (PYRL) State's Payroll System
 - Employee Information Center (EIC)
 - Information Warehouse (FLAIR IW) and Various Reporting Tools
- Statewide Project where agencies must remediate their agency business systems





Why is Florida PALM Happening NOW?



- FLAIR is at end-of-life
- FLAIR is over 40-years old and becoming more and more difficult to maintain
- Since the technology it is built upon is outdated, finding development staff to maintain and improve FLAIR is increasingly more difficult
- Must be able to meet changing standards (e.g., GASB, Legislative)



What is Changing?

- Everything tied to FLAIR is changing (what makes FLAIR unique)
 - Chart of Accounts (COA) Structure, Transaction Types, Interfaces, Reports
 - Processing Logic, Workflow, User Interface, Data Structure / Reporting
- FLAIR Org Code will no longer exist
- ▶ FLAIR Account Code (29-digit code) will no longer exist
 - Some attributes will be retained as separate Chart of Accounts values
 - Some attributes will not exist (e.g., GAFR Fund, IBI, Year)
 - New COA elements are available to agencies
- End Users are expanding due to expanded capabilities




What are Key Aspects of the Florida PALM Timeline?

- Replaces all components of FLAIR for all agencies simultaneously
- Focuses on implementing solution capabilities that meet the State's current financial and payroll needs (replaces FLAIR, does not replicate!)
- Minimizes overlapping of implementation stages (i.e., design, build, test)
- Provides for a post implementation period that includes additional resources and focus on operational stability

- Allows State Project resources to move through the system release lifecycle for the Financials and Payroll implementations
- Allocates extended time and a dedicated environment for agency testing
- Acknowledges the importance of reporting by:
 - providing advanced reporting capabilities
 - empowering agencies through data and self-service reporting capabilities









Agency Implementation Roadmap

- Purpose: Ensure agencies are completing the necessary activities to ready their people, processes, technology and data for the Florida PALM Implementation in January 2026
- Use: Inform the Project, the Executive Steering Committee and Executive Stakeholders of each agency's progress and readiness
